Father Bouchard to be in Rome for the closing of the Holy Year

Father Bouchard will be blessed to be in Rome from November 14 to 21, accompanied by his friend Father Michael Nagle, pastor of the Parish of the Good Shepherd, Martha's Vineyard. They will be visiting their friend and classmate, Father George Bellenoit, who is there on sabbatical. Together they will concelebrate and help distribute Communion at the Mass for the closing of the Holy Year on Sunday, November 20. Father Paul Canuel, retired pastor, and Father Kevin Cody will cover the sacramental needs of the parish in Father's absence.

THIS WEEK AT MASS

Wednesday, November 9: Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. Today marks the anniversary of the dedication of the cathedral church of Rome (that is, the pope's cathedral). It was dedicated to the Savior, later to John the Baptist.

Thursday, November 10: St. Leo the Great, pope and doctor of the Church (+ 461). An eminent pastor and preacher, he defended the Roman primacy, combated heresies, contributed to the declarations of the Council of Chalcedon (4451) and saved Rome from the marauding Huns and Vandals.

Friday, November 11: St. Martin of Tours, bishop (+ 397). From Hungary, he was a soldier who became a Christian. He founded the first monastery in the West. He was the first non-martyr to have a feast in the Western Church.

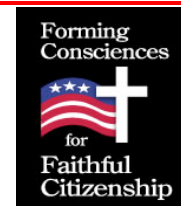
SPIRITUAL WORKS OF MERCY
